WHAT IS A COMMON READING?

This is a book chosen by the Oglethorpe campus community especially for entering freshmen to read together as they begin their college experience together. Professors and instructors of the <u>First Year Seminars</u> will also read the book, and other faculty, staff, students, alumni, and friends are encouraged to join in. New students should obtain the book over the summer and finish reading it by fall orientation.

WHY THIS BOOK?

The Things They Carried is recommended by the National Endowment for the Arts' <u>Big Read</u> project for community or campus Common Reading projects. The Oglethorpe faculty and staff who chose the 2012 book were especially interested in the connections to "Narratives of the Self", the freshman Core seminar. Another thing they considered was the very high interest in war by our current students whose lives have largely been shaped by terrorism, war, and the impacts of both. The book is accessible and easy-to-read.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT?

The Things They Carried is a collection of stories about American infantrymen in the Vietnam War, drawing on the author's own experience as a drafted soldier during the conflict. The stories describe the environment and experience of fighting in the Vietnam jungles, but they also examine memory, emotion, truth, and whether we can make sense of terrible experiences and big questions.
